Worship, Formation, & Children - From the Rector

As we continue to develop our ministries and worship together we are going to begin doing some exciting things!! Here is a run down of some things that will begin in October.

Worship As folks may recall we tried an experiment in July and August of our 10am service being a spoken service on the first Sundays of those months. The feedback I received was mostly positive. There were folks who didn't expect to like worship with no music who were pleasantly surprise. There were others who missed the music who in the past had almost always attended a spoken service. The beauty of worship in the Episcopal Church is that there are multiple options for worship. For the first Sundays of October, November and December we will have **two** services. An 8am spoken service and a 10am service with music. For now, the 8am service will be the same as the 10am one, just with no music. The dates for the 8am service are: October 5, November 2, and December 7. After the December service we'll make a determination about continuing with this schedule and if there is anything we want to change.

Formation Formation is something that should continue throughout our lives. We can always learn something new, and we can always grow in faith and understanding. So...on the second Sunday of the month (mostly – there will be a couple changes to that schedule so pay attention to the dates) there will be a formation presentation, mostly inter-generational so everyone is welcome, during coffee hour. The dates for formation the next three months are: October 12, November 16, and December 14. Information about topics for these dates is forthcoming! **Children** Children in worship are an absolute gift to us and to them. Their presence reminds us of the joy and innocence in believing that we had as children. For the children seeing their parents, guardians, or other adults they love and trust worshipping God reinforces that behavior. Church can also get long and boring for them sometimes because they can't see what is happening at the altar. So...the third Sunday of the month will be a "Kids day". On these days in particular I will invite any children present to join me around the altar. The upcoming dates for this are: Oct 19, Nov 16, and Dec 21.

I am excited about these additions to our communal life. Join us as we continue to learn and grow and worship together. *Xathleen+*
